7	2022 Financials and 2023 Budget  The Treasurer presented 2022 PMI CWCC Financial statements and compared them with the budget for 2022. The 2022 budget projected a deficit of \$35,740, but we ended up with a surplus of \$33,750.  Total Equity represents Chapter's Reserve. Even if we have an annual deficit of \$40,000 each year, we have almost 8 years of reserve.  For the 2023 Budget: we are planning to increase chapter's income by 11.5% (\$24.5k) and increase chapter's spending by 61% (\$110k).  We are projecting more revenue from PMWest Conference and Programs events. In addition, we have increased budgets for each	Andrzej N.
